At an Intervening court held for Essex County at Pappahannock on the 17<sup>th</sup> day of April 1875 - This Last Will and Testament of Robt Gordon decd was proved by the oath of Thomas B. W. Gray one of the subscribing Witnesses thereto, and the said Gray also made oath that George Perkins the other subscribing Witness to the said Will, subscribed his name as a Witness thereto in his presence and in the presence of the Testator, and that the said George Perkins is dead, and the Court being satisfied with this proof the said Will was ordered to be Recorded.

And at a Quarterly Court held for Essex County at Papp<sup>th</sup> on the 18<sup>th</sup> day of May 1875 - On the motion of William Gordon a certificate was granted him in order to his obtaining letters of administration of all the goods chattels and credits of Robert Gordon decd with this last will and testament annexed, he having first taken the oaths required by law and entered into and acknowledged a bond payable to the sitting justices in the penalty of twelve hundred Dollars, with Susanna Gordon and Elizabeth Gordon his security. In the name of God Amen, I Isaac Dishman of s<sup>t</sup> Anne Parish in the County of Essex being in perfect sense and memory Blessed be God, do make this my last Will and Testament as follows -

I give to my cousin Sarah Dishman my Negro Girl Mira with her future increase, to Obed Gray his heirs Executors and administrators in trust, for the following uses, trust intents and for no other use or purpose whatsoever, that is to say for the sole maintenance of my cousin Sarah Dishman during her natural life, and at her death, I give the same to her children to them and their heirs forever -

being in perfect sense and memory Blessed be God, do make this my last Will and Testament as follows.

I give to my Cousin Sarah Dishman my Negroe Girl Mira with her future increase, to Obed Gray his heirs Executors and administrators in trust, for the following uses, trust interests and for no other use or purpose whatsoever, that is to say for the sole maintenance of my Cousin Sarah Dishman during her natural life, and at her death, I give the same to her children to them and their heirs forever.

I give to Obed Gray my Negroe boy Harry to him and his heirs forever.

I give to John Gray my Land recovered of Ewell A. Coyle to him and his heirs forever.

I lend unto my Sister Jean Dishman my Land whereon I lived in Caroline County and my Negroe Woman Sydda during her natural life and at her death I give the same to my Cousin Margaret Gouldman to her and her heirs forever.

All the remainder of my estate which I have not already mentioned, after paying my just debts I give to my Brother John Dishman to him and his heirs forever.

I do constitute and appoint my Brother John Dishman and Obed Gray Executors to this my last Will and Testament, in witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this first day of February in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and fifteen.
