

## Morrison Files Bill Of Particulars In Ouster Case

On Tuesday of this week, Commonwealth's Attorney, Horace T. Morrison, filed a bill of particulars, with King George Circuit Court, listing 18 "instances" in support of his motion for removal of Sheriff J. S. Dishman.

Morrison made his request for the removal of Dishman and Trial Justice Bascom S. Pribble, last Thursday, at a special meeting of the county grand jury, which indicted a woman on a numbers writing charge.

The motion by Morrison caught the county officials by surprise.

Circuit Court Judge Leon M. Bazile had given Morrison until Tuesday of this week to present detailed reasons for his charges of malfeasance, misfeasance, incompetency and gross neglect of duty, which he charged against Dishman.

Charges against the 68-year-old sheriff will be heard by the Circuit Court on May 29.

The motion for the removal of Justice Pribble, which will be heard in court on September 28, alleges that the King George Board of Supervisors had not entered on its records, a formal approval of the appointment of Justice Pribble, who serves in King George and Stafford County.

Board of Supervisors of counties involved, are required by state law to approve appointment of one person to two justiceships.
